(Romans 1:1-5) January 8, 2023

GOSPEL STRANDS

GOSI EL STRANDS
The Gospel (the good news of what God did in Christ) is simple but never S
Romans 5:6-11 offers the gospel ("Christ died for us") but also strands of the gospel message: The gospel is rooted in the L of God. The gospel is given because we were P, still S, and God's
E The gospel means we are J by the blood of Christ. The gospel's goal is S and R
Romans 1:1-5 offers the gospel ("the good news is about God's Son") but also strands of the gospel message: The gospel was announced through the P in the Holy S
The gospel is about the Jewish Messiah, descended through the line of D (see 2 Tim 2:8)
The gospel also means that G are offered life with God. (see Eph 3:6; Gal 3:8; Gen 12:2)
FOUR KEY QUESTIONS
Jesus said OT scriptures are about him, then he "opened their M" to understand the Scriptures (Luke 24:25-27, 44-45).
The Biblical storyline asks 4 key questions, and the gospel provides the framework for answers: (1) Where did I C from? (2) What went W? (3) How will it be made R? (Gospel)
(3) How will it be made R? (Gospel) (4) How do I P?
Some sample themes where these questions are answered: creation, covenant, and exile.
