## TWO MISUNDERSTANDINGS

One problem is failing to see where the Gospel S The gospel starts with Jesus Christ, based on what He accomplished, which is why salvation is by grace through faith (Eph 2:6-9; Titus 3:3-7).
A second problem is failing to see where the Gospel L The gospel leads to changed lives by His Spirit (Eph 2:10; Titus 3:8; Titus 2:11-14), which is why judgment takes our works into account (Matt 16:27; Rev 2:23).
"The Gospel that is all about God at work in Christ is still a story about God at work in Christ when Christ moves into your life."
This is why the Bible says we can O the gospel (1 Pet 4:17; Rom 10:16) or W in step with (according to the truth of) the Gospel (Gal 2:14).
Dallas Willard: "The gospel is less about how to get into the Kingdom of Heaven after you die, and more about how to $L$ in the Kingdom of Heaven before you die."
TWO IMPROPER MOTIVATIONS
Two improper motivations are $F$ and $P$ These can restrain the heart, but they cannot $C$ the heart.
Tim Keller: "Instead of trying to bend ourselves and others into conformity with Christ, the gospel M people into conformity with Christ." (See Eph 5:25-33; 1 Pet 3:1).
GOSPEL-CENTERED CHANGE
