| NOT GUILTY |
|---|
| Jesus tells the woman caught in the act of adultery: "I do not C you either. Go, but do not sin again" (John 8:11 GNT). |
| LOVE FOR THE WORLD |
| John 3:16 shows God's U love for the world, since he loved us when we were ungodly and enemies of the cross (See also Rom 5:6-11). |
| NO CONDEMNATION |
| John 3:17 says that God did not send His Son into the world to C it. |
| There is now no C for those who are in Christ Jesus (Rom 8:1; see also Rom 8:31 39). |
| John 3:18 says that whoever believes in Him is not C |
| FORGIVEN FOREVER |
| 1 John 1:7 says the blood of Jesus (continually) cleanses us from A our sins. |
| 1 John 1:9 says God is faithful and just to F us our sins. |
| 1 John 2:1 says Jesus Christ, the righteous one, is our A to plead our case on the basis of His own death for our sins. |
| 1 John 3:20 says that when our heart condemns us, God is G than our heart. |
| 1 John 5:13 says that John wrote his letter to you who believe in the name of the Son of God, tha you may K that you have eternal life. |
