#### LESSONS FROM COVID: FELLOWSHIP & JUMPING SHIP

(Hebrews 10:23-25)

We learned that we need each other; that community is E\_\_\_\_\_.

We learned that assembling together, for many, appears to be O\_\_\_\_\_.

Learning From Our COVID Reasoning:

- (1) Church actually involves an A\_\_\_\_\_.

#### WHAT GOD HAD IN MIND: LOVING FELLOWS IN THE FELLOWSHIP

Fellowship means to S\_\_\_\_\_ or P\_\_\_\_\_.

Christian fellowship involves money (Rom 15:26; 2 Cor 9:13; Heb 13:16), goods, services (2 Cor 8:4), evangelism (Phil 1:5), faith (Philemon 6) and even S\_\_\_\_\_ (Phil 3:10).

Our fellowship is with G\_\_\_\_\_ and with each O\_\_\_\_\_ (1 Cor 1:9; 2 Cor 13:14; 1 Jn 1:3, 7).
